#### <u>ProBNP Reference Ranges and</u> Discontinuation of Alere Triage BNP

After review, MJH Chemistry Department decided to update reference ranges for the ProBNP assay. The ranges are based on the PRIDE study and assist in ruling in or ruling out CHF.

The new Reference Ranges are:
< 50 years old < 450 pg/ml
50-75 years old <900 pg/ml
>75 years old <1800 pg/ml

On June 1, 2015 MJH Chemistry will no longer offer the Alere Triage BNP assay but will continue to offer the Roche ProBNP assay.
